



The University System of Georgia offers a healthcare plan for Graduate Research Assistants (GRA). It is a requirement for all graduate students to maintain Affordable Care Act (ACA) compliant medical coverage. Graduate students are automatically enrolled in the Student Health Insurance Plan (SHIP), through UnitedHealthcare Student Resources Insurance, upon completing course registration. GRAs who provide adequate documentation of other coverage (through parents, a spouse, another employer, the ACA marketplace, etc.) can waive out of the SHIP requirement. Graduate Research Assistants also have the option of enrolling in the USG GRA plan instead of the SHIP. The USG encourages graduate students to compare all options available to them to determine what best meets their needs. International students may have additional requirements and/or restrictions associated with their visa status and should consult with the appropriate campus resource for further detail. The following students are required to enroll in the USG SHIP unless they waive out based on USG Waiver Requirements.*

- -All graduate students receiving a Full Tuition Waiver as part of their graduate assistantship award.
- —All undergraduate and graduate international students holding F or J status.
- -All undergraduate and graduate students enrolled in programs that require proof of health insurance.
- -All graduate students receiving fellowships that fully fund their tuition.
